

Open House Review

If you haven't been to a chamber open house lately, you're missing out! Since our March newsletter was printed, we have had two great open houses. The first was "The Art of Doing Business," Wednesday, February 26, hosted by the Titusville Council on the Arts at Farmers National Bank. More than a dozen local artists lined the lobby to exhibit examples of their work, ranging from photography to oil painting to jewelry making to furniture design. Subway, Sheetz, Titusville Dairy, and The Blue Canoe Brewery provided food and beverages for guests while Joe Thompson and Friends supplied musical entertainment. This particular evening served as a meet and greet so names and artwork could be put with faces and area business people could network with one another and the artists. The lively crowd of more than eighty enjoyed the sights and sounds beneath one of Titusville's greatest artworks, the Colonel Drake mural. We are grateful to the Titusville Council on the Arts for all its members do to encourage creativity and appreciation of the arts in our community.

Thursday, March 20, the Titusville VFW Post #5958 opened its doors to the chamber. The social hall, decorated with party lights and patriotic memorabilia, was filled with about fifty chamber members and guests. The VFW shared favorites from their menu including garlic knots and stromboli. VFW Honor Guard member and Senior Vice, Donnie Taylor shared some information about the beginning of the Titusville VFW. His father was a founding member. Bar Manager Debbie McClellan described just some of the activities the VFW does: bar room bingo on Tuesdays, sponsoring scholarships for local students, supporting troops and veterans, and participating in community service projects. On Tuesday, April 1, the Titusville Area Chamber of Commerce and Titusville Rotary Club will be hosting a joint luncheon highlighting the internationally acclaimed program, "Pennsylvania Free

Enterprise Week." John J. Trombetta, president & CEO of the organization that presents PFEW each summer, will talk about the program and the unique opportunities available to students throughout the state and specifically in the Chamber's service

The subject of Mr. Trombetta's talk is "The American Free Enterprise System - Do Our Kids 'Get It' - Does Anyone?!" The Foundation for Free Enterprise Education annually presents PFEW to qualified high school sophomores and juniors throughout the state. Now celebrating its 36th year of operations, PFEW was founded by the Pennsylvania business community specifically to teach our state's youth about the wonders of the private enterprise system and also about the issues that face all U.S. companies, and specifically those located in the commonwealth.

PFEW is open to all current 10th and 11th graders and will host five, seven-day sessions in July and August on the campuses of Lycoming College and the Pennsylvania College of Technology respectively, both located in Williamsport. All students accepted into the program will receive a full scholarship (the actual value of the scholarship is roughly \$1,500 per student) donated by a Pennsylvania business or civic organization. Moreover, each of the two host campuses offers automatic scholarship grants to any PFEW graduate who ultimately ends up matriculating through their school as an undergraduate. In the case of Lycoming College, total award is \$20,000 for each PFEW alumnus. In the case of the Pennsylvania College of Technology, the total grant is \$8,000.

If you have children or grandchildren who are age-appropriate, we hope you will come to the luncheon to hear more about this internationally acclaimed program and hear from a local student who is a graduate. If you are interested in public awareness about the importance of business and private enterprise, PFEW has been filling what many perceive as a gap in public education for its entire thirty-five year history. A total of nearly 250 volunteers from the business community will be onsite this year to actually deliver the program. This year PFEW will graduate its 34,000th student with a vastly improved understanding of what the private sector means to the American way of life.
